NEW ACQUISITION



Sèvres Porcelain Manufactory **Pair of jugs** (Petites buires) **1794**

David Roche Gallery is pleased to acquire a pair of jugs made at the Sèvres Porcelain Manufactory with the support of DRG volunteer and benefactor Dr Leslie Stephan.

The jugs' unusual *petite buire* form is inspired by the antique and correlates with designs held in the Manufacture Nationale de Sèvres archives. No expense was spared in the decoration, from the rare *fond d'Or* gilt ground embellished with rich garlands of flowers and fruit to the finely painted trophies that represent Republican motifs. Decorated by painters and gilders Philippe Parpette and André-Joseph Foinet ('la France') in April 1794, these motifs feature illustrations of the French Constitution of 1793, the Declaration of the Rights of Man and of the Citizen, and two representations of the plumb line and square surmounted by a Phrygian cap.

Such overt Republican decoration is rarely seen on Sèvres porcelain, especially on the luxurious gilt ground. Created at the height of the Reign of Terror, this pair of jugs significantly strengthens the David Roche Collection's capacity to discuss shifts in French politics in the last decade of the eighteenth century.

A sizeable proportion of the Sèvres manufactory's most loyal clientele were eliminated during the 1790s but the manufactory endured and later flourished with the support of Napoleon.

David Roche Gallery is indebted to John Whitehead and Leslie Stephan for their assistance in the research of these handsome jugs. The jugs are currently displayed in the Drawing Room of Fermoy House, alongside other significant pieces from Sèvres and other European porcelain factories.




