Nature Revealed: Rosa Fiveash & Ellis Rowan

Now on display

The Australian wildflower paintings of Fiveash and Rowan come together for the first time in this landmark exhibition exploring South Australia's rich botanical collections. Challenging Victorian conventions, Ellis Rowan travelled widely and enjoyed international acclaim for her wildflower paintings, and the work of Rosa Fiveash attracted the interest of Australia's leading botanists. Vibrant and painterly, Rowan's large watercolours of wildflowers are exhibited with the delicate botanical paintings of South Australian artist Fiveash. For many this will be the first opportunity to marvel at the botanical art created by these two inspiring women. Luminous, exquisite and meticulous, their watercolours reveal some of Australia's most beloved and endangered native flora.

BEST IN SHOW 2025 Australian Photographic Dog Prize



David Roche Gallery has announced the inaugural *Best in Show 2025: Australian Photographic Dog Prize*. This biennial prize pays homage to the legacy of our founder, David Roche AM (1930-2013), and celebrates the many ways in which dogs play a central role in our lives.

Co-judges of *Best in Show 2025* are DRG Director Robert Reason and Alex Cearns OAM. DRG is delighted that internationally renowned animal photographer Alex Cearns has joined the judging panel. Commenting on her appointment she said:



"It is a privilege to celebrate the artistry and passion of photographers of all levels who share my love for capturing the essence of dogs. I eagerly anticipate viewing the submitted images that embody the spirit of this prestigious award." Alex has photographed more than 15,000 dogs in her studio, received over 350 awards for photography and authored 8 books.

Entries open to amateur and professional photographers with a first prize of \$5000.



TODAY'S TREASURE



Nicolas Panagiotti Zarokilli

Portrait of Grand Duke Dmitri Pavlovich

This month marks 6 years since the death of Martyn Cook, David Roche's trusted advisor on art and antiques for many years and the inaugural Director of the David Roche Foundation House Museum.

Martyn generously left a bequest of fine and decorative arts to the foundation, which are proudly incorporated into our displays to this day. Visitors to our recent Chester Weinberg exhibition may remember the Maison Jansen brass yucca plants and the Italian tree stump pedestal with its marvellous red levanto marble top, both of which were part of Martyn's bequest.

One of the most intriguing works from Martyn's bequest is a drypoint etching of Grand Duke Dmitri Pavlovich. Executed about 1920, this work is one of a group of portraits depicting members of the Russian Imperial Family shortly after the 1917 uprising. It is executed by Nicholas Panagiotti Zarokilli (1879–1945), a Greek artist who achieved prominence in the United States designing patriotic poster art during World War I and magazine covers for *The Saturday Evening Post* and *The Blue Book Magazine*, among others. After the war, Zarokilli returned to Europe and portrayed a number of royal and noble subjects including members of the Spanish Royal Family, the Archbishop of Canterbury, and former Prime Minister of the United Kingdom Arthur, 1st Earl of Balfour.

Zarokilli donated a portfolio of his drypoint etchings to the British Museum, London in 1920, and others are held in the Fitzwilliam Museum, Cambridge. Zarokilli's portrait of Grand Duke Dmitri Pavlovich is displayed in the Russian Room of Fermoy House.
