Nature Revealed:

Rosa Fiveash & Ellis Rowan

Final weeks! Must close 24 May

The Australian wildflower paintings of Fiveash and Rowan come together for the first time in this landmark exhibition exploring South Australia's rich botanical collections.

Challenging Victorian conventions, Ellis Rowan travelled widely and enjoyed international acclaim for her wildflower paintings, and the work of Rosa Fiveash attracted the interest of Australia's leading botanists.

Stethoscopes, Sketchbooks & Shade houses:

Doctors, artists and the ongoing conservation of South Australia's flora



Thursday 15 May 6:00–7:15pm at David Roche Gallery

Join Jerry Smith as he traces South Australia's orchids through a century of interwoven efforts—from Rosa Fiveash's stunning 19th-century sketches to the urgent mission of saving endangered species like the Bayonet Spider-orchid, Caladenia gladiolata. This talk reveals how artists, doctors, and scientists, each in their own way, have contributed to a shared journey of conservation.

See how a flower once drawn on paper is now being saved through seed banking and post-fire recovery at the South Australian Seed Conservation Centre. It's a story of persistence, teamwork, and hope for SA's native flora, brought to life with vivid pictures.

Discover how past efforts guide the present and learn how to help write the next chapter in this ongoing tale of protecting the state's botanical treasures.

About the speaker

Jerry Smith is a Senior Scientific Officer with the South Australian Seed Conservation Centre. He has spent 25 years getting his hands dirty in flora conservation across South Australia, especially in the Mount Lofty Ranges. He's part of a small, passionate team working to secure the future of our native plants—like the endangered *Caladenia gladiolata*—through seed banking, propagation, and post-fire recovery.

Before joining the Centre, Jerry managed *Back from the Brink*, a major project to boost the survival of some of SA's most threatened species, which is where his love for orchids and teamwork really took root. He's here to share the story of how artists, scientists, and conservationists—past and present—are keeping SA's flora alive, one seed at a time.

TODAY'S TREASURE

An ornithological cabinet plate



Pierre Neppel factory, Paris c.1815

This wonderful plate decorated with a pheasant is the work of the Pierre Neppel factory. Established in Paris in 1805, the factory achieved a high level of excellence for its wares.

The border of the plate is decorated with a matt gilt ground and oval panels of stylised gilt rosettes. These frame a large, magnificently coloured bird with red, blue, yellow and brown plumage, perched on a tree branch within a wooded riverscape. A large stone block in the foreground is inscribed 'le Faisan hupé de la chine'.

The image derives from the work of George-Louis Leclerc Buffon (1707–88) the French naturalist who held the position of intendant at the Jardin du Roi. His seminal work was the *Histoire Naturelle*, *générale et particulière....* (Natural History, General and Particular....) an encyclopaedic collection of 36 volumes. The *Histoire naturelle des oiseaux* were the nine volumes dedicated to birds, published between 1770 and 1783. There Buffon describes *La Faisan doré ou Le Tricolor huppé de la Chine* (The Golden Pheasant or, The Crested Tricolour of China).

Buffon attached much importance to the illustrations accompanying his text and François-Nicolas Martinet (1731–c.1800) depicted the birds. The image on this plate is almost identical to Martinet's illustration.

The golden pheasant (*Chrysolophus pictus*) is a species in the family Phasianidae, order Galliformes. It is native to China which earned it the name Chinese pheasant. It also has the name of tricolour pheasant. Like many birds, the species exhibits noticeable sexual dimorphism. The male's plumage has striking colours which made it a frequent sight in aviaries and zoos, whilst that of the female's colouring is muted brown.

David Roche purchased this plate at auction in 2007. It was formerly the property of Giampaolo Lukacs, a noted ceramics dealer and scholar. Today the plate can be seen in the Drawing Room at Fermoy House, surrounded by other important examples of European eighteenth and nineteenth century porcelain.

William Morris was one of the greatest pattern designers of all time: his work remains enduringly popular. He is famous for his superb textiles and wallpapers. Morris's London design firm Morris & Company (1861–1940) was one of the most successful and progressive in Victorian Britain. It had an international clientele that extended to Australia, largely through Adelaide's Barr Smith family.
