

# Kay Finch's dog charm bracelet

This charm bracelet belonged to Kay Finch, a leading Afghan Hound breeder, American Kennel Club hound and toy judge, and artist. The bracelet, which was assembled during the 1940s-1960s, consists of 25 pendants and charms on a curb-link chain.

Several charms refer to American, Canadian, and Mexican Champion Crown Crest Zardonx. Whelped in July 1954, 'Zar' won the highly contested Best in Show at the Afghan Hound Club of America Speciality Show in February 1957, just one title among the 8 Best in Show and 45 Best of Breed titles he collected by June of 1957, and another Best in Show at the A.H.C.A the following year. Zardonx and AM CH Crown Crest Tae-Joan produced Crown Crest Zardeeka in 1958, who would whelp Mr Roche's famous UK AUST CH Mazari of Carloway in 1962.

The bracelet also makes many references to Kay Finch's zodiac sign, with gold Leo charms by Birmingham jewellers William Adams Ltd; and silver charms produced by Tallerres de los Ballestros and Margot de Taxco (Mexico), Guglielmo Cini (United States) and David Andersen (Norway).

A special and likely unique charm was made by Kay Finch herself. It shows the sterling silver head of an Afghan hound, moulded with detail and superior expression, the gilding worn down after many years.

The period of Mrs Finch collecting and owning these charms coincides not only with her champion dog kennels, but also her own artistic career. Her love for both



# Roche (Viscount Fermoy) family crest

Another item discovered is this round steel die engraved with the family crest of the Viscount Fermoy Roches, the Lords of Fermoy in north Cork, who were expelled and removed from their properties in the late 1600s due to Catholic insurgency. This canting crest shows a sea bird standing with wings spread on a rocky outcrop (Roche being the old French derivative of rock), holding a roach fish out of the water with one claw, fish being a common symbol for Christ. The crest is often matched with the motto "Mon Dieu est ma roche" / "My God is my rock".




